

# DISCLOSURE OF ELECTRICITY LINE CHARGES

## DISCLOSURE OF POWERCO'S LINE CHARGES EFFECTIVE 1 APRIL 2007

Powerco is required under Requirement 27 of the Electricity Information Disclosure Requirements 2004 to disclose the line charges that make up part of your electricity price together with the number of end users on each pricing options.

Powerco provides line business activities to Electricity Retailers and invoices those Retailers for line charges and the Retailers then invoice for supply of electricity inclusive of line charges. Accordingly Powerco cannot guarantee that the line charges specified herein are the line charges that Retailers invoice to end users in the event that Retailers choose to modify charges to end users. All charges exclude GST (Goods and Services Tax). Other lines and use of system charges or conditions may also apply. Please refer to the full Powerco Pricing Schedule. For retail electricity prices please see your Retailer.

Powerco is not required to disclose line charges if the number or estimated number of consumers by whom the line charge is to be paid is less than 5.

\* The Total Demand Charge includes the Transmission component. The Transmission component includes recovery of Transpower's connection, interconnection and new investment charges. Transpower's loss rental rebates and Transpower's EVA rebate do not form a part of the individual line charges. These items will be paid or credited directly to Retailers on a monthly basis based on the actual amount invoiced or rebated by Transpower.
